

Salivary Gland Cancer UK research grant policy

1. To be eligible for consideration for funding from SGC UK, your research should be focused on one or more of the salivary gland cancers.
2. Grants can be awarded to those undertaking research in any country, and are not limited to UK researchers, provided your research can demonstrate a benefit for UK patients.
3. Your research should aim to improve our understanding of salivary gland cancer, its treatments, or the experience of those living with it. This includes developing our knowledge of the basic biology of these cancers, as well as their diagnosis and treatment, and living with and beyond salivary gland cancers. As a charity, we have developed our core aims using patient-clinician co-production. Your research should support one or more of these aims and we ask in your application that you demonstrate the links to these aims, where applicable.

4. Your grant proposal should cover not more than 4 sides of A4, and should include:

- Details of the research background
- Aims
- Method
- Personnel
- Budget
- Timeline of your research project
- Lay summary
- Reporting timeline explaining how and when you will report back to SGC UK on your findings.
- Impact on patient benefit
- Appendix – two-page CV of key personnel

5. Your proposal will be considered by Salivary Gland Cancer UK and may include researchers, clinicians, and patient advocates, depending on the type of grant applied for. Awards will be granted wholly at their discretion. SGC UK will perform a risk assessment and due diligence as part of this process.
