KEY CHECKS FOR EARLY DETECTION

It's important to stay alert for the signs of Salivary
Gland Cancer.

Key checks include:

- Pain or swelling in the mouth or neck area
- Lumps or swelling near the jaw, neck, or inside
the mouth
- Difficulty swallowing or opening the mouth
wide
- Numbness or weakness in the face

If you experience any of these symptoms, it's
essential to seek medical advice.

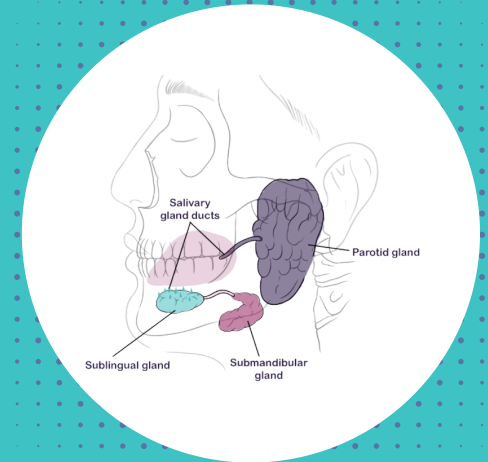

salivary glands, 25% are in the
minor glands and 25% occur
outside the head and neck area in
the breast, vulva, trachea, and skin.**
